Pellet Pre-Buy until June 30 - Order now for best pricing!

We are pleased to announce that we will be offering both bagged and bulk **Vermont Wood Pellets** again this year. As in years past, there are a limited number of tons available to us. In order to allocate those tons as early as possible, we are

announcing **a pre-buy from now until June 30**. Prices will go up on July 1, and likely again in October. Vermont Renewable Fuels will deliver both bagged and bulk pellets for us this year and our coordinator, Gwen, will handle the scheduling.



Delivered prices for bagged and bulk depend on delivery quantities, and start as low as \$274 per ton for co-op members.

A local pick up option will also be available in Middlebury for \$273 per ton (\$275 if ordered after July 1) or \$5.75 per bag (10 bag minimum), both paid in advance. Details are still being finalized; we will let you know the particulars of this option as soon as they are available.

Please remember that all pellets, bagged (delivered or picked up) and bulk, must be ordered and paid for in advance, and memberships must be current to receive discount pricing.

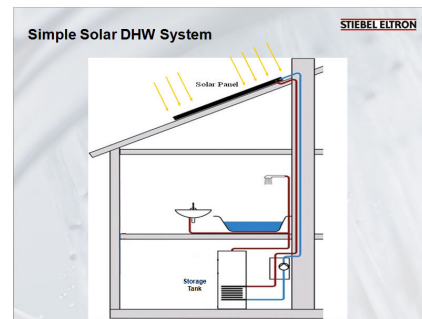

The Solar Decathlon is a biennial international green building competition, sponsored by the U.S.

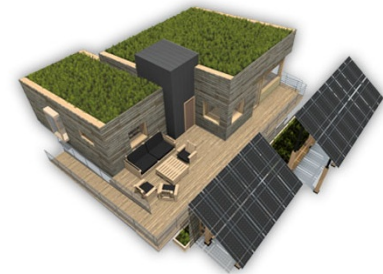
Department of Energy, for which colleges and universities from around the world submit design proposals. Once again, Middlebury College has been selected as **one of the twenty teams** to design and build an entirely solar-powered house. This year's competition will take place October 3-13, 2013 at [Orange County Great Park](#) in Irvine, California.

The 2013 Middlebury Team has called its design **"InSite."** From its form to the materials used, the home is inspired by Middlebury, VT and **Shannon Street-its future home** after the competition.

The design aims to engage the community while also offering the privacy and comforts that appeal to the 21st

Century home buyer. With the Five Points of InSiteful Design as guiding principles, **InSite is an elegant example** of the future of residential

architecture-a future that respects environmental, economic, and social sustainability.



In addition, a guided tour of the completed solar powered home is scheduled for **Saturday, August 3, 1-3 p.m.** at Middlebury College. Mark your calendars.

New Co-op Board Member and Officers

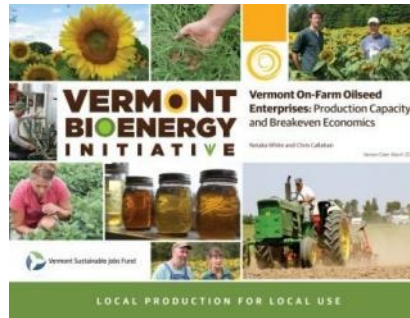

Vermont Bioenergy Videos

In April 2013, the Vermont Sustainable Jobs Fund produced a series of educational videos called "**Bioenergy NOW! Made**



in Vermont," featuring the work of the Vermont Bioenergy Initiative. Begun in 2005, the Initiative seeks to provide grants and technical assistance to Vermont farms, biofuel businesses, researchers, and entrepreneurs to develop Vermont's bioenergy feedstocks, fuels,

and infrastructure.

These videos highlight farmers, scientists, and others working at the forefront of the local-production-for-local-use movement who, to quote one of the videos, "are proving that local food systems and clean energy production together are economical, compatible, and essential." They **tell the compelling stories** of farmers running their equipment solely on fuel they grew for biodiesel, the possibility of growing grasses for heating fuel, and using algae for biofuels and wastewater management.
